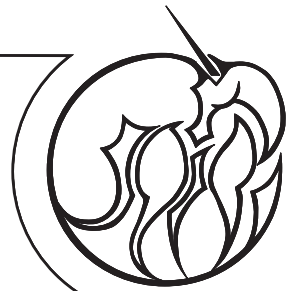

**Jeff Smith: Bone and Beyond**

**The Wexner Center**--Time magazine called Jeff Smith's Epic Bone one of the 10 greatest graphic novels of all time in 2005. Here's your chance to discover, or delve deeper into, the work of this artist. The exhibition--a partnership between the Wexner Center and the Ohio State Cartoon Research Library--features approximately 80 original drawings: black-and-white pages from Bone, full-color Bone covers, and images from Smith's recent Shazam series for DC Comics and from Rasl, his current project about a time-traveling thief. The show also includes original images by Charles Schulz, Walt Kelly, George Herriman, and other comic artists that Smith considers influences or favorites.
