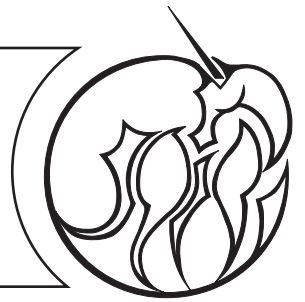

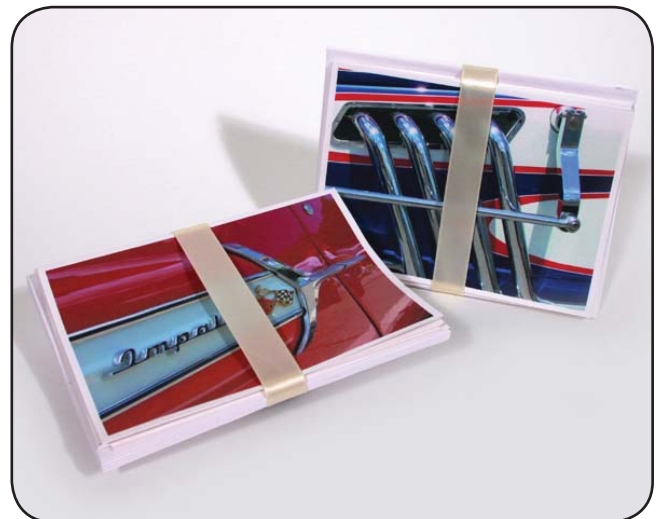

The American Soldier: A Photographic Tribute from the Civil War to Iraq is currently on view at the Ohio Historical Center in Columbus, Ohio. This dramatic exhibition of photographs captures the essence of the American soldier over 150 years —ever since the birth of photography when the camera became a notebook to history. More than 100 enlarged photographs in the exhibition cover America in conflict during the Civil War, Spanish-American War, Boxer Rebellion, World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Gulf War, Afghanistan and the Iraq War. *The American Soldier* captures the danger and frustration, the humor and beauty, the camaraderie, death and victory that the American soldier has encountered throughout history.



THE CIVIL WAR
1861-1865

The men and women who join up because they are proud to serve their country. When there is peace, their readiness is the backbone of our security. In battle, they fight to protect us.

This exhibition includes photographs from nine wars, starting with the bloody Civil War clashes in the nation's heartland to the fighting in the streets of Baghdad. It's about those soldiers, Army and Marines, who know the face of the enemy and the hellfire of war.

Though it's more than 150 years since the birth of photography, the camera has become the soldier's historical notebook, recording the lives and times of these brave warriors. As photography improved, so did the record of the American soldier. This camera got closer and closer to a soldier's life as it captured hard times, humor, courage, camaraderie, honor, victory and for some, the ultimate sacrifice, death.

The exhibit continues through December 30, 2011 at the Ohio History Center in Columbus, Ohio. Companion exhibits include:

Over Here, Over There and At Home: Ohioans in Times of War. Ohio's proud tradition of military service has brought change, advances in democracy and new shared memories. Follow the stories of why we fight, how war changes us, and how we remember

Follow the Flag. The stirring stories behind the Ohioans who carried our battle flags are as powerful as these symbols of courage and honor. See actual Civil War battle flags and experience these stories in the words of those who lived them.
